25.10.2011	14	Barnsley Hospital NHS Foundation Trust: Correspondence	<p><b>Letter from Mr Z I Nur, Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon, Barnsley Hospital, to Mrs Elaine Jeffers, Divisional Director, Surgical Services</b></p> <p>"...Unfortunately there has been a very low standard of treatment with this serious injury. First of all she was sent home with no-one recognising in Casualty what the actual injury was. The x-ray was then reported by the Radiographer and again this was not picked up. The patient has now been admitted for elevation and internal fixation.</p> <p>We have always had concerns regarding x-rays being reviewed by the Radiographers and there have been many incidents in Fracture Clinic where we know that an x-ray has been reported with no fracture but we can see a fracture or where a fracture is not present but has been reported as showing a fracture.</p> <p>This incident is most certainly going to lead to medico-legal proceedings. The injury itself is quite bad to give the patient some problems in the future and unfortunately the delay in treatment would be blamed for her ongoing problems in future..."</p>

The talonavicular joint was fixed with k-wires. She was then in plaster which was taken off after 6 weeks. She was then offered physiotherapy but she wanted to see a foot and ankle specialist..."

No other significant abnormality is seen."
